

Obituary for George Nolan Born: September 28, 1934, Died: November 4, 2020

George R. Nolan, 86, of Montgomery, passed away at 8:17 a.m. Wednesday, November 4, 2020 at his home. He was born September 28, 1934 in Daviess County, Indiana to the late Clara Ruth (Feagans) and Lawrence J. Nolan II. George married Elizabeth (Miller) Nolan on June 18, 1955 and she preceded him in death.

George graduated from Montgomery High School in 1952. He then attended Purdue University and graduated in 1956 with a bachelor's degree in agriculture. After graduating from college George worked for the Soil and Water Conservation. He then returned to the family farm where he was a grain farmer and raised sheep, hogs, and cattle. He was a two-time recipient of the "Conservation Farmer of the Year" award. George was a member of St. Peter Catholic Church, former member of All Saints Catholic Church and Knights of Columbus 630. He was a member of the Montgomery Ruritan Club and was a past president.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Clara Ruth and Lawrence J. Nolan II; wife, Liz Nolan and sister, Rita (Harold) Schnarr.
